Camp near Brandy Station Va.

February the 21st 1864

Sir

Being as there is a good deal of dissatisfaction existing amongst the recruits in the old 67th respecting the time they will be discharged The understanding I had with the Major was that I would be discharged at the expiration of the organization of the Regt which I believe expires next August But our Col wants to hold us for the full three years Now I have served just 18 months I cannot reenlist and get the bounty but I could declare my intention to reenlist and go home on a furlough along with the veterans but the bounty I could not get But what I want to know is when will we be discharged If the Major was here we would be all right but he is not here and I fear wont be So I thought I would ask your opinion There is nothing strange going on in the army at present all is quiet But I must close for the present Yours Respectfully
