Baltimore May 27. '64

My dear wife

I arrived here last evening after great delay on the Road as the train did not make the connection at Harrisburg and the train from that point to this which should have left at 7 O'clock did not get there until near 12 O'clock.

But when I got here I found all the news good. Richard is certainly taken prisoner & is said not wounded & Dr McCarstairs who came from Admiral Lee with despatches this morning assures me He also has promised to send a letter for me to Richard as he says that Major Mulford goes up with the flag of truce to Port almost

every day & I will also drop
Harry a line - Perhaps he may
get it -

I hope that you are still
improving and in good spirits
as you certainly have no reason
to be uneasy. But on the contrary
much to be thankful to a benign
Providence for the preservation of
our dear Son & his health
Alex Maria & the children are
all well & Tom is going about as
usual
