Executive Chamber,

Harrisburg Pa. 22 June 1865

My dear Sir

You will notice that I presume on our friendly relations and my knowledge of your mode of home when you read this letter -

Some two days since on my return home from Philadelphia your nephew Colonel H. McCannell called upon me to ask the privilege of visiting my family and particularly my oldest daughter - I said of course I knew his family and that I had no objections - After some days I heard he had been here some time and that he did not always give the same account of himself - He told a number of my family when spoken to on the subject that you would be here to see me on Monday or Tuesday - That you had so telegraphed him -

Yesterday morning I heard his servant at the Hotel was my head



and that he was departing -

I had I felt it my duty to  
tell my daughter - He told me you  
would be here yesterday at noon and  
I sent my messenger to all the hotels  
with a note asking you to call - I had  
we (and told my nephew that you  
did come but that when he told  
you what had occurred you went  
immediately back home on the next  
train -

Now my dear Sir you have  
a family and can realize my  
anxiety to do my duty to my children  
and at the same time not to injure  
them to any person -

I fear Colonel McFarland  
is not behaving well, but I hope  
you will be present with me
